OH, WHAT A BEAUTIFUL MUSICAL!

THE CURTAIN RISES ON A FARM IN CLAREMORE IN 1906. AN OLDER WOMAN IS CHURNING BUTTER. A LONE COWBOY ENTERS SINGING A SONG ABOUT HOW BEAUTIFUL THE MORNING IS. IN 1943, THAT SIMPLE OPENING SCENE CHANGED THE FACE OF AMERICAN MUSICAL THEATRE FOR ALL TIME.

Two well-known, successful writers collaborated for the very first time to create one of the greatest musicals ever to open on Broadway – OKLAHOMA!

Richard Rodgers had already written 27 hit musicals with collaborator Lorenz Hart and hundreds of popular songs such as My Funny Valentine; Bewitched, Bothered, and Bewildered; Blue Moon; Falling in Love with Love; and many, many others.

Oscar Hammerstein II had also written a number of hit shows with composers such as Jerome Kern, Sigmund Romberg, and Rudolf Friml including another ground-breaking musical SHOW BOAT. In 1942, Rodgers and Hammerstein decided to collaborate for the first time on a musical based on Lynn Rigg's play GREEN GROW THE LILACS.

OKLAHOMA opened on March 31, 1943 and ran for 2212 performances closing May 29, 1948. It included such great songs as *Oh What a Beautiful Morning, People Will Say We're In Love, Surrey With a Fringe On Top*, and the immortal title song – *Oklahoma!* It has been revived on Broadway numerous times and played all around the world. I've done the show three times at the Fireside. It's been 33 years since the last time we presented OKLAHOMA



and it's high time we bring back this timeless classic.

I'm very excited about doing it again. We've come a long way in 33 years. Our productions have grown technically and artistically and this new production will be, by far, the best of all the past productions.

This is a rare chance for you to see a first rate, professional production of one of Broadway's most enduring, most entertaining, most beautiful musicals. Don't miss it!

The Verona Senior Center has one of the busiest and most robust activity calendars you'll find. The wide variety of options is a result of Stephanie's energy, her desire to please everyone, the range of interests in their several thousand 50 or older members, their wonderful staff, the volunteer trips committee, a great facility and support from the city. Plus, about 95% of their activities are free, as is membership itself. Their goal – to improve the quality of life for their members. Because they're "people people!"

On a typical day, such as the one we spoke to Stephanie, about 250 people would be at the center participating in one thing or another. The list included social hour, exercise, chair yoga, a mobile library, acupuncture, blood pressure checks, tech time, a movie, genealogy class, line dancing, ageless grace, transit rides to two pharmacies, and delicious catered meals that can be either grab and go, delivered, or enjoyed at the center. Looks like something for everyone!

Their day trips, usually twice a month, include a show at The Fireside, Janesville's Rotary Botanical Gardens, the East Troy Railroad and Yerkes Observatory, History and Heritage of Green Bay, and even a hometown tour in nearby Fitchburg where they toured a Bavarian Sausage factory and enjoyed lunch at Quivey's Grove. Stephanie contracts with Collette Tours to provide week-long trips such as New England Fall Color and Greece. In 2026, she's venturing into planning her own starting with overnights to closer interesting locales such as Chicago, Michigan, and Dubuque.

Fun facts about OKLAHOMA! Rogers and Hammerstein's first musical collaboration opened on Broadway in 1943. In 1967 Oklahoma! opened in Tokyo, Japan with an all-female cast. In 1976 the original cast recording of Oklahoma! (the first of its kind) was inducted into the Grammy Hall of Fame. In 1993, it's 50th anniversary year, Oklahoma! was awarded a special commemorative Tony Award. Oklahoma! also is notated as the first true "integrated musical." Before "Oklahoma!," musicals
